- 1. Lesson planning is an important component of effective teaching and learning process and it is also one way to enhance the expertise of teachers in employing successful strategies in the classroom.
- 2. Lesson plans do not only communicate to learners what they will learn and how they will be assessed, but these also help teachers organize content, materials, time and instructional strategies.
- 3. On this premise, all teachers are therefore reminded that part of the eight hours they are mandated to stay in the school campus is the preparation of the lesson plans or Daily Lesson Log.
 - 4. Teachers are given the elbow room to decide on the kind of plan to prepare.
 - 5. Teachers may have the following options in preparing the lesson for the day:
 - a. 5 part lesson plan where objectives, subject matter, procedures, assessment and assignment are reflected;
 - b. iPlan as initiated before by Region VII (detailed)
 - c. Daily Lesson Log (please see attached template)
- 6. Regardless of the format used, it is strongly urged that teachers must have the hard copies of the Lesson Plans in their custody every day.
- 7. School Heads must regularly check the plans and must see to it that both they (SHs) and the teachers have the copies also of the Curriculum Guides.
