

Overview:

The Saceda Youth Lead ASEAN YOUTH EXCHNAGE is an Honors Program that will empower students to become most effective citizens of the country by giving them opportunities in leadership, community service and exchange.

This exchange brings in the best and the brightest students of the school who are empowered through this international exchange to become the future leaders where they are expose to various opportunities and experiences for total human development.

The trip creates a platform for students to appreciate and understand the geo-political issues in the ASEAN and Asia Pacific regions by personally witnessing, discussing and exploring local poverty, education, socio-economic, cultural and political issues. This is a bigger effort to train the students to be acutely aware of regional and global affairs and grasp the ramifications and impacts. The program aims to ignite the heart and spirit of altruism and volunteerism. The exposure will play a noteworthy role in the personal development of the students.

Purposes:


