



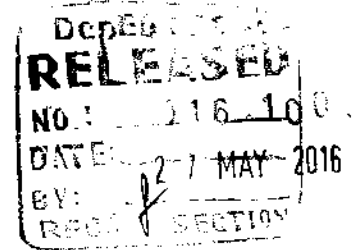

Warm greetings!

ABK3 LEAP is a 5-year project (2012-2016) funded by the United States Department of Labor (USDOL) that is reducing child labor in sugarcane farms in 11 provinces in the country through a multi-sector approach that integrates initiatives in livelihoods, education, advocacy and social protection. As of April 2016, the project has reduced hazardous child labor by 86% within the 54,479 children from 30,412 households directly supported.

As we leave the communities that we've journeyed with for the past 4 1/2 years, the project conducted a good practice analysis to document the initiatives and practices that have shown promising results in helping us reach our goal of reducing child labor in the sugarcane farms. It is our hope that ABK3 LEAP's good practices in child labor reduction will be sustained and replicated not only by our partners but by fellow anti-child labor advocates around the country who continue to seek ways to eliminate child labor in the country.
